RELATIONAL MINISTRY

- 3. List the names of people who regularly reach out to and get to know others.

- 1. Think back over the teaching in your ministry during the last six months. What percentage of the time has that teaching been devoted to helping people understand Christ more clearly?
- 2. What misconceptions of Christ are most prevalent in your congregation?
- 3. On what aspects of the person and work of Christ are your people most clear?
